Intensive Trade Project with South Korea

From Thursday 19th January to Saturday 21st January, 2017 Kyungpook National University from South Korea organizes together with the Korean Central Office KoreaPen an intensive training for 34 Korean university students.



Supported by EUROPEN-PEN International and the German Central Office ZUEF this training aims to help Korean students acquire global competences required in starting up and running an own business.

Divided in 9 groups the Korean students will trade on two days with existing practice enterprises in the world wide network to validate their business ideas and business models.

We wish the duration of the camp would be longer. It would be better if the camp is extended and we can learn more.

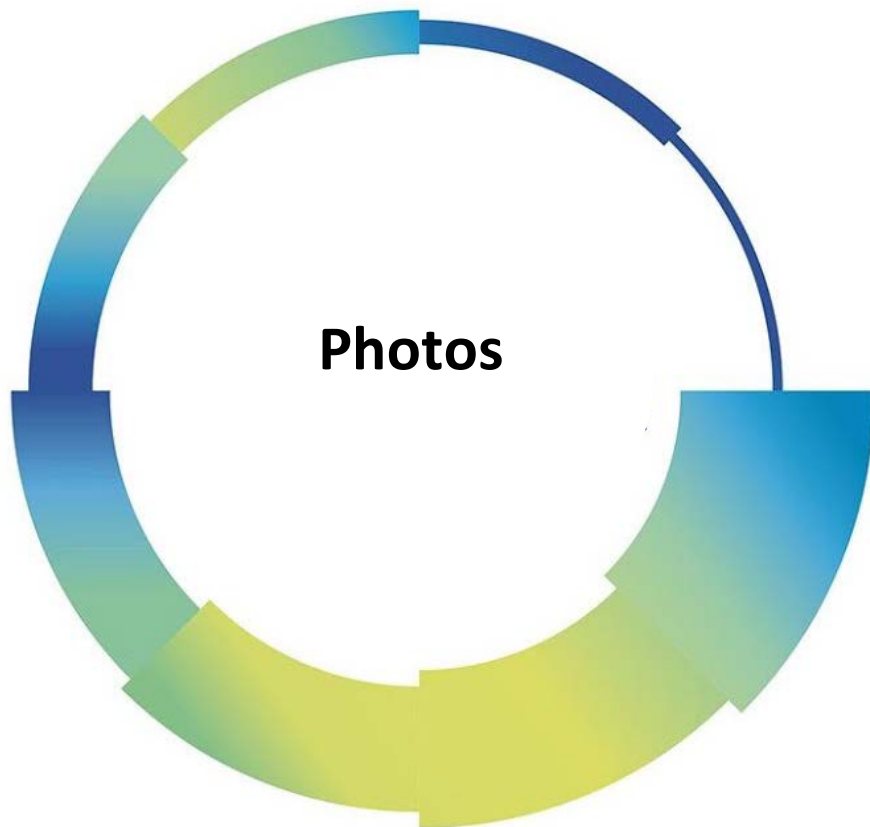
TEAM COSMIC GUYS
